The SICC promotes First Nations' language development, revitalization and retention. To encourage First Nation children to write in First Nations' languages, SICC launched an annual book writing contest in 2011. This contest is open for students from grades K to 12. Entries must be written in a First Nations language with an English translation and have a First Nations cultural theme. Entries will be reviewed and judged by the Book Writing Contest Committee and will select the winning books based on creativity and originality. The book may contain illustrations but is not necessary as illustrations will be provided for the winning story. The 2015 winner will be announced at the 2015 SICC FNLKC in November 2015.

We extend congratulations to the winner of the 2014 Book Writing Contest, a student from the Little Red River School for his winning submission, a Woodland Cree book entitled "pahkwēsikan" or "Making Bannock." The SICC wishes the best of luck to this year's entrants.

Saskatchewan Indian Cultural Centre First Nations' Language Keepers Conference 2015 Annual Book Writing Contest

Contest Description

The Saskatchewan Indian Cultural Centre (SICC) proudly promotes Saskatchewan wide First Nations' language development, revitalization and retention. To encourage First Nation children to write in their First Nations' languages, SICC launched an annual book writing contest in 2011. For 2015, First Nations youth will have from January 15 to June 30, 2015 to create their books for the contest and the winner will be announced at the 2015 First Nations' Language Keepers Conference (FNLKC).

This annual book writing contest is open to Saskatchewan First Nations students from grades K-12. The books must be original fiction, written in a First Nations language along with an English translation. The first place winner will receive a \$500 cheque and 20 copies of their published book and the student(s) will be honored at the 2015 SICC FNLKC reception night to launch their book. The second place winner will receive 20 copies of their published book.

Contest Guidelines

- 1. Submissions must be from Saskatchewan First Nations students in grades K-12.
- 2. Students may submit as an individual, a small group or class.
- 3. Students may enlist the help of their families or educators.

- 4. Submissions must be written in a Saskatchewan First Nations language along with an English translation.
- 5. Stories must be an original idea from the student(s) and focus on a First Nations cultural theme.
- 6. The SICC will ensure that the First Nations language is corrected to SRO and include syllabics.
- 7. Incomplete submissions will not be considered as winner(s).
- 8. Submissions must be received by June 30, 2015 by 4:00 pm CST.
- 9. One book will be selected to win.
- 10. The winner will receive \$500 and 20 copies of their published book and will be invited to launch their book at the SICC FNLKC Reception Night. The second place winner will receive 20 copies of their published book.
- 11. Illustrations will be accepted but are not necessary.

First Nations Language Keepers Conference 2015 SICC Annual Book Writing Contest – Key Dates

The 2015 SICC First Nations Language Keepers Conference (FNLKC) Annual Book Writing Contest Call for Submissions will be mid-January 2015. The call for submissions will be faxed to Tribal Councils, First Nations band offices, First Nations institutions and pertinent school divisions.

The 2015 SICC Book Writing Contest deadline for submissions is June 30, 2015 at 4:00 pm CST. The Saskatchewan Indian Cultural Centre will not accept submissions after this date.

A review of the submissions and decisions of the winner(s) will occur the week of July 6-10, 2015. The SICC Book Writing Contest Committee will review all submissions and choose the winner(s).

The winner(s) will be notified by phone after the SICC FNLKC Book Writing Contest Committee meets. The SICC will notify all contacts of the submissions by phone and in writing of the results of the decision of the Committee. The first place winner will receive \$500 and 20 copies of their published book at the FNLKC. The second place winner will receive 20 copies of their published book.

The 2015 SICC Book Writing Contest winner(s) book(s) will be created during the 2015 summer months. The winning book(s) will be created by SICC staff for release at the 2015 SICC FNLKC.

The 2015 SICC Book Writing Contest first place winner will attend the 2015 SICC FNLKC Reception November 24, 2015 to launch their book. The first place winner will be invited to attend the 2015 SICC FNLKC Reception to introduce themselves, their book, read it and sign copies of their book.

The winners will be announced on the first day of the 2015 SICC FNLKC on November 25, 2015. The winner(s) of the contest will be announced at the Conference as well as on the SICC website and social media.

- Create an original story in a First Nations' language (an English translation must be provided as well) with a First Nations cultural storyline.
- Submissions must be received by June 30, 2015 by 4:00 p.m.
- The first place winner will receive \$500 and 20 copies of the published book. The second place winner will receive 20 copies of their published book.

Entries will be reviewed and judged by the Book Writing Contest Committee and will select the winning books based on creativity and originality. The book may contain illustrations but this is not necessary. Illustrations may be provided by SICC for the winning stories selected.

The winners of the contest will be announced at the First Nations' Language Keepers Conference in November 2015.
